Chair Tim Michot called the Regular Council Meeting of May 27, 1993, to order.

Councilmember Louis Benjamin, Jr. was called upon to deliver the invocation and lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chair Michot then welcomed everyone to the meeting and asked for continued participation in Parish Government.

At this point, Councilmember Broussard asked Steve Dupuis, Legal Counsel, that since the newly-developed precinct lines (for consolidated government) were not part of the package voted on by the electorate, will this have to go back to the voters?

Mr. Dupuis explained that the districts were drawn up with the assistance of LAPC. At the same time, the School Board districts were also drawn up. When the Charter was voted and approved by the electorate, the districts included and accepted in that vote were the identical districts that the School Board had. When the School Board made their submission to the Dept. of Justice, the Dept. of Justice had some problems with those districts. Eventually they were rejected, new district lines were proposed, and in March the Dept. of Justice did pre-clear those districts. Parish Government anticipates that when the submission is made for the City/Parish Consolidated Charter, the same situation will occur. If that happens, the Home Rule Charter itself provides that the commission reconvenes for a period of up to 90 days, it proposes amendments, and those amendments will need to go back to the electorate. This will be a vote on the proposed amendments and not a new vote on whether or not there will be consolidation.

Councilmember Broussard then asked what would happen if the amendment to the precincts lines fails.

Mr. Dupuis stated that he posed the same question to Ed Abell, Chairman of the City/Pansh Consolidation Commission, and it is his belief that in the unlikely event that this would happen, possibly it would go into the Federal Courts to make a determination if those districts were appropriate or not.

Councilmember Louis Benjamin then stated that he has filed a complaint regarding the precinct lines created by the City/Parish Consolidation Commission. Mr. Benjamin continued by saying that he telt that certain minority districts had been gerrymandered to dilute minority strengths.

### PROJECT UPDATE

Bill Campbell, Parish Engineer, reported that upon contact with the State Engineers in Baton Rouge, they have completed their technical review of plans and specifications for Phase III and an inspection of the project will be scheduled in the next couple of weeks.

Bill Campbell, Parish Engineer, reported that almost all projects under construction are near completion.

## DISCUSSION

(SIDE 1)(198) AGENDA ITEM NO. 6: Lafayette Regional Airport.

Mr. Bob James, Chairman of the Lafayette Airport Commission, reported the following:

- 1. recognized members of the Lafayette Airport Commission as Dr. Jim Ingram (Vice-Chairman), Dale Sisley (Secretary/Treasurer), Donnie Dugal and Bill Lowry.
- 2. introduced Bill Domingue, newly-appointed Director of Aviation.
- 3. during Hurricane Andrew, the airport was used for a Presidential visit to this area and accommodated relief efforts.
- In 1992, Sertoma Air Show included the Canadian Snowbird Team. In 1993, the Blue Angels will appear.
- 5. In 1993, Greg Roberts was appointed as the new Deputy Director of Aviation.
- 6. special projects included the improvement of the terminal parking area, the security

enhancement program, the rehabilitation of the lighting and power supply for the field including the emergency generator, the master plan was completed, preliminary phases have been set for the improvements and overlay of Runway 22 left, 4 right, and many others.

- 7. In 1992/1993, over \$5.5 millions worth of projects were either completed or were currently under construction. Of this amount, \$4.3 million were Federal funds from FAA and the State of Louisiana.
- 8. In 1993, 4 airlines are flying in and out of Lafayette with 20 flights a day.
- 9. In 1993, Continental Airlines announced they would be pulling out of Lafayette. With the support of the community, local governments and travel agencies, Continental Airports was convinced to come back with 1 jet flight a day.

Chair Michot then thanked the Commission for their volunteer service to the community.

Section 3-77.1: Sales of beverages of high alcoholic content by package houses and supermarkets limited for off the premises consumption - It is prohibited for package houses and supermarkets to sell or dispense intoxicating, spirituous, vinous or malt liquors of an alcoholic content of more than six (6) per cent by volume for off the premises consumption between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and II:00 a.m. on Sundays, between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on Mondays, and between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays.

Section 3-77.2: Sales of beverages of low alcoholic content by package houses and supermarkets limited for off the premises consumption - It is prohibited for package houses and supermarkets to sell or dispense intoxicating, spirituous, alcoholic, vinous or malt liquors of an alcoholic content of less than six (6) per cent by volume for off the premises consumption between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on Mondays, and between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

At this point, Mr. Burk Foster, head of the USL Criminal Justice Department, along with Steve Smith, Criminal Justice Intern, and Nina McGuire, Graduate of the Criminal Justice Program, was recognized for their role in creating this program.

Mr. Foster stated that over the past 4 months, approximately 200 potential inmates have been interviewed for the Pre-Trial release program and slightly a third (60) have actually been released. Of those 60, 11 have been re-arrested or have had their release revoked. The funds which have been appropriated in Ordinance No. 042-93 is to provide continuity in the program in-between semesters until new interns can be oriented.

Councilmember Roy then stated that it is estimated that between \$11,000 and \$15,000 have been saved since January because of this program.

Councilmember Schouest then requested a list of the students who volunteered for the program be sent to the Clerk of the Council and certificates of appreciation be prepared for each of them. Also, that a photo be coordinated with the students, the Sheriff, the Parish President and the Chair of the Council.
